A fabulous experience — Performing in PolyU

What kind of English activities have you participated in since you started studying in secondary school?

Leanna: All of us are members of the school's English Drama Club. We acted in a musical "Step by Step" at school last year. We also joined a three-week study tour to Australia. This year, we have become English Ambassadors and help organize English activities like English Speaking Days and Spellathon.

Suki: In the first term, we participated in the drama performance organized by the English Department in Hong Kong Polytechnic University. Also, Leanna and I joined the English Speech Festival. Leanna got second place last year and I got second place this year. Then, we both acted in the play "Six Reasons not to be in a Play" and performed in the Graduation Ceremony at our school.



How does joining English activities benefit you?

Erica: We have a lot of fun and learn English more carefully. For example, we need to polish our pronunciation during drama rehearsals and make sure our pronunciation and articulation are appropriate before the show. It's a great way to practise English speaking.

Winnie: I was afraid of communicating with foreigners in the past. Through participating in various English activities at school, I have become more and more confident of speaking English.

Will you share with us how you can learn English?

Wincy: I think the most effective way to learn English is to speak more or write more. In particular, we have to practise using the language in our daily life. For example, we had to speak English all the time when we were on the study tour in Australia. It's an effective way to improve English.

Erica: Also, it helps if we pay attention in lessons and jot down notes for revision.
